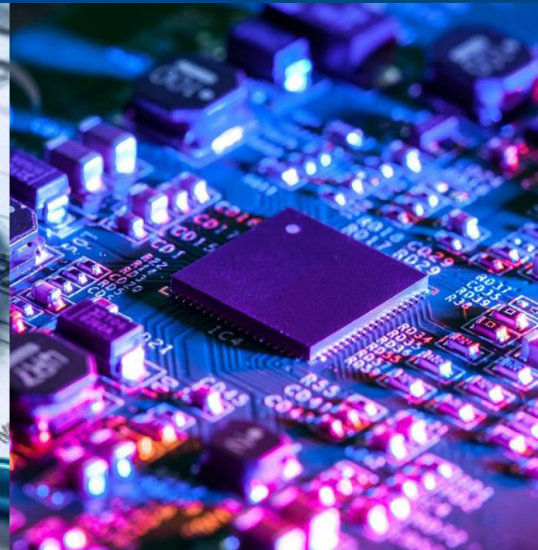
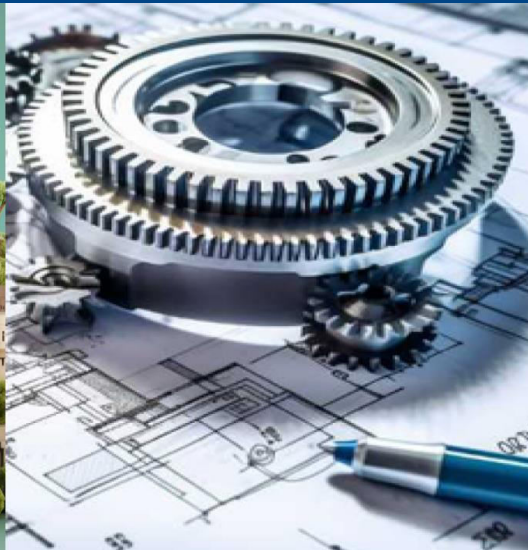
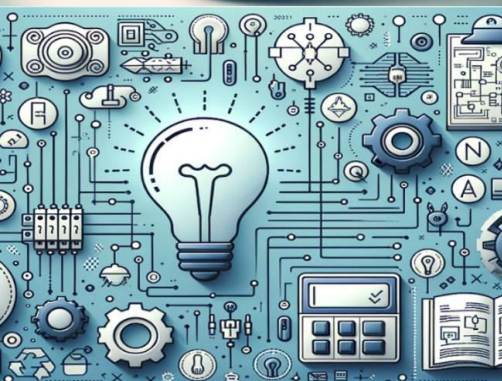




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The Significance of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in India's Economic Development
